1[66]:3 I say to him; "Sir, if they perpetrated such deeds that the glorious angel is embittered, what have I done?" "They cannot be afflicted otherwise," saith he, "unless thou, the head of the [whole] house, be afflicted;

1Co 10:13

There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but Alahayim is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it

The Trial of our Repentance & it's Benefits

Hermas Parable 7

1[66]:4 "But behold, Sir," say I, "they have repented with their whole heart." "I am quite aware myself," saith he, "that they have repented with their whole heart; well, thinkest thou that the sins of those who repent are forgiven forthwith? Certainly not; but the person who repents must torture his own soul, and must be thoroughly humble in his every action, and be afflicted with all the divers kinds of affliction; and if he endure the afflictions which come upon him, assuredly He who created all things and endowed them with power will be moved with compassion and will bestow some remedy. 1[66]:5 And this (will Alahayim do), if in any way He perceive the heart of the penitent pure from every evil thing.

Hermas Parable 8

6[72]:1 After [the shepherd] had examined the rods of all, he saith to me, "I told thee that this tree clingeth to life. Seest thou," saith he, "how many repented and were saved?" "I see, Sir," say I. "It is," saith he, that thou mayest see the abundant compassion of the Lord, how great and glorious it is, and He hath given (His) Spirit to those that are worthy of repentance.

6[72]:2 "Wherefore then, Sir," say I, "did they not all repent?" "To those, whose heart He saw about to become pure and to serve Him with all the heart, to them He gave repentance; but those whose craftiness and wickedness He saw, who intend to repent in hypocrisy, to them He gave not repentance, lest haply they should again profane His name."

1 Samuel 2:3

Talk no more so exceeding proudly; let not arrogancy come out of your mouth: for Ahayah is a Ala of knowledge, and by him actions are weighed.

Hermas Parable 7

- **Fortitude** - strength of mind that enables a person to encounter danger or bear pain or adversity with courage

Php 2:4

Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others. Php 2:5 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Yache:

Understanding True Repentance in Alahayim's Sight

Jubilees 1

9. For they will forget all My commandments, (even) all that I command them, and they will walk after the Gentiles, and after their uncleanness, and after their shame, and will serve their alahayim, and these will prove unto them an offence and a tribulation and an affliction and a snare.

10. And many will perish and they will be taken captive, and will fall into the hands of the enemy, because they have forsaken My ordinances and My commandments, and the festivals of My covenant, and My Sabbaths, and My holy place which I have hallowed for Myself in their midst, and My tabernacle, and My sanctuary, which I have hallowed for Myself in the midst of the land, that I should set My name upon it, and that it should dwell (there).

11. And they will make to themselves high places and groves and graven images, and they will worship, each his own (graven image), so as to go astray, and they will sacrifice their children to demons, and to all the works of the error of their hearts.

14. And they will forget all My law and all My commandments and all My judgments, and will go astray as to new moons, and Sabbaths, and festivals, and jubilees, and ordinances



.... 15. And after this they will turn to Me from amongst the Gentiles with all their heart and with all their soul and with all their strength, and I shall gather them from amongst all the Gentiles, and they will seek Me, so that I shall be found of them, when they seek Me with all their heart and with all their soul.

19. And Moses fell on his face and prayed and said, "O Ahayah my Alahayim, do not forsake Thy people and Thy inheritance, so that they should wander in the error of their hearts, and do not deliver them into the hands of their enemies, the Gentiles, lest they should rule over them and cause them to sin against Thee. 20. Let Thy mercy, O Ahayah, be lifted up upon Thy people, and create in them an upright spirit, and <u>let not the spirit of Beliar rule over them to accuse them before Thee, and to ensnare them from all the paths of righteousness, so that they may perish from before Thy face.</u>

21. But they are Thy people and Thy inheritance, which Thou hast delivered with Thy great power from the hands of the Egyptians: create in them a clean heart and a holy spirit, and let them not be ensnared in their sins from henceforth until eternity." 22. And Ahayah said unto Moses: "I know their contrariness and their thoughts and their stiffneckedness, and they will not be obedient till they confess their own sin and the sin of their fathers.

23. And after this they will turn to Me in all uprightness and with all (their) heart and with all (their) soul, and I shall circumcise the foreskin of their heart and the foreskin of the heart of their seed, and I shall create in them a holy spirit, and I shall cleanse them so that they shall not turn away from Me from that day unto eternity.

24. And their souls will cleave to Me and to all My commandments, and they will fulfil My commandments, and I shall be their Father and they will be My children. 25. And they will all be called children of the living Alahayim, and every angel and every spirit will know, yea, they will know that these are My children, and that I am their Father in uprightness and righteousness, and that I love them.

Jubilees 1:5-6

5. And He said: "Incline thine heart to every word which I shall speak to thee on this Mount, and write them in a book in order that their generations may see how I have not forsaken them for all the evil which they have wrought in transgressing the covenant which I establish between Me and thee for their generations this day on Mount Sinai.

Testament of Solomon 22

...and I waste away the beauty of virgin women, and estrange their hearts."

- **Estranged** - cause (someone) to be no longer on friendly terms with someone. (of a person) no longer close or affectionate to someone; alienated. (of a wife or husband) no longer living with their spouse.

Joseph and Asenath chapter 2:1,4-5

1. Now Aseneth despised all men and regarded them with contempt; yet no man had ever seen her, for Pentephres had a tower in his house, and it was large and very high.

- **Despised** feel contempt or a deep repugnance for.
- **Repugnance** intense disgust.

- **Contempt** - the feeling that a person or a thing is worthless or beneath consideration.

4. And the ceiling of that room was of gold; and within it were ranged the innumerable alahayims of the Egyptians, in gold and silver.

5. And Aseneth worshipped all these; and she feared them and offered sacrifices to them.

Chapter 4:5–12,15-16

5. And Pentephres said to his daughter Aseneth, "My child", and she said, "Lo, here I am, my lord."

6. And he said to her, "Sit down, please, between us; I want to talk to you." And Aseneth sat down between her father and her mother.

7. And her father Pentephres took her right hand in his right hand and said to her, "My child"; and Aseneth said, "What is it, father?"

8. And Pentephres said to her, "See, Joseph, the mighty man of Alahayim, is coming to us today, and he is ruler of all the land of Egypt, for Pharaoh has appointed him ruler of all our land; and he is the distributor of corn throughout the country and is to save it from the famine that is come upon it.

9. And Joseph is a man that worships Alahayim: he is discriminating, and a virgin (as you are today), and a man of great wisdom and knowledge, and the spirit of Alahayim is upon him, and the grace of the Lord is with him.

10. So come, my child, and I will give you to him as his wife. You shall be his bride, and he shall be your bridegroom forever."

11. And when Aseneth heard what her father said, <u>a great red sweat came over her, and</u> <u>she was furious and looked sideways at her father.</u>



12. And she said, "Why should my lord and my father speak like this and talk as if he would hand me over like a prisoner to a man of another race, a man who was a fugitive and was sold as a slave?

15. No! I will marry the eldest son of the king, for he is king of all the earth."16. On hearing this, Pentephres thought it wiser to say no more to his daughter about Joseph, for she had answered him arrogantly and in anger.

Tob 3:7

It came to pass the same day, that in Ecbatane a city of Media Sara the daughter of Raguel was also reproached by her father's maids;

Tob 3:8 Because that she had been married to seven husbands, whom Asmodeus the evil spirit had killed, before they had lain with her...

Sir 7:23 Hast thou children? instruct them, and bow down their neck from their youth.

1Co 7:32

But I would have you without carefulness. He that is unmarried careth for the things that belong to the Lord, how he may please the Lord:

1Co 7:34

There is difference also between a wife and a virgin. The unmarried woman careth for the things of the Lord, that she may be holy both in body and in spirit....

Sir 7:24

Hast thou daughters? have a care of their body, and shew not thyself cheerful toward them.

Leviticus 19:29

Do not prostitute thy daughter, to cause her to be a whore; lest the land fall to whoredom, and the land become full of wickedness.

Whore H2181 (Strong)

זנה

A primitive root (highly *fed* and therefore *wanton*); to *commit adultery* (...); figuratively to *commit idolatry* (the Jewish people being regarded as the spouse of Ahayah): - (cause to) commit fornication, X continually, X ... (be an, play the) harlot, (cause to be, play the) whore, (commit, fall to) whoredom, (cause to) go a-whoring, whorish.

to commit fornication, be a harlot, play the harlot
 act as a harlot...
 (Pual) to play the harlot
 to commit adultery
 to cause to commit adultery
 to be a cult prostitute
 to force into prostitution
 to be unfaithful (to Alahayim) (figuratively)

Polycarp to Philippians 4:6

...then your wives to walk likewise according to the faith that is given to them; in charity and in purity; loving their own husbands with all sincerity, and all others alike with all temperance;

Tit 2:3

The aged women likewise, that they be in behaviour as becometh holiness, not false accusers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things;

Tit 2:4 That they may teach the young women to be sober, to love their husbands, to love their children,

Tit 2:5 To be discreet, chaste, keepers at home, good, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of Alahayim be not blasphemed.

Testament of Solomon 23

23. And I said to him: "Is this thy only business?" And he answered me: "I transport men into fits of madness and desire, when they have wives of their own, so that they leave them, and go off by night and day to others that belong to other men; with the result that they commit sin, and fall into murderous deeds."

- Transport overwhelm (someone) with a strong emotion, especially joy.
- Madness extremely foolish behaviour.
- **Desire** a strong feeling of wanting to have something or wishing for something to happen.



Ephesians 6:12

For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

Simeon 5:3

Beware, therefore, of fornication, for fornication is mother of all evils, separating from Alahayim, and bringing near to Beliar.

Rueben 7:4

For in fornication there is neither understanding nor holiness, and all jealousy dwelleth in the lust thereof.

Gad 7: 7

Put away, therefore, jealousy from your souls, and love one another with uprightness of heart.

Testament of Solomon 34, 36, 38

34....And there came seven spirits , females, bound and woven together, fair in appearance and comely. And I Solomon, seeing them, questioned them and said: "Who are ye?" But they, with one accord, said with one voice: "We are of the thirty-six elements of the cosmic ruler of the darkness ."....The second said: "I am Strife."The fourth: "I am Jealousy."

36. Likewise, also the second said: "I am Strife, strife of strifes....

38. Likewise also the fourth said: "I cause men to forget their sobriety and moderation. I part them and split them into parties; for Strife follows me hand in hand. I rend the husband from the sharer of his bed, and children from parents, and brothers from sisters...

Proverbs 28:25 He that is of a proud heart stirreth up strife:

Proverbs 29:22

An angry man stirreth up strife, and a furious man aboundeth in transgression. Proverbs 15:18 A wrathful man stirreth up strife: but he that is slow to anger appeaseth strife.

Pro 28:25 ...but he that putteth his trust in Ahayah shall be made fat.



Proverbs 19:11 The discretion of a man deferreth his anger; and it is his glory to pass over a transgression.

Proverbs 20:3 It is an honour for a man to cease from strife: but every fool will be meddling.

Proverbs 10:12 Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins.

Joseph 17

2 Do ye also, therefore love one another, and with long-suffering hide ye one another's faults. 3 For Alahayim delighteth in the unity of brethren, and in the purpose of a heart that takes pleasure in love

Pro 17:9

He that covereth a transgression seeketh love; but he that repeateth a matter separateth very friends.

Testament of Solomon 82 82. The eleventh said: "I am called Katanikotaêl. I create strife and wrongs in men's homes, and send on them hard temper.

The Importance of Parents Raising the Family Right

The Epistle of Polycarp to the Philippians 4:6

[6] And teach ourselves first to walk according to the commandments of the Lord; and then your wives to walk likewise according to the faith that is given to them; in charity and in purity; loving their own husbands with all sincerity, and all others alike with all temperance; and to bring up their children in the instruction and fear of the Lord.

Ecclesiasticus 22:3 An evilnurtured man is the dishonour of his father that begat him: and a foolish daughter is born to his loss.

Ecclesiasticus 30:3 He that teacheth his son grieveth the enemy: and before his friends he shall rejoice of him.

Ecclesiasticus 22:4 A wise daughter shall bring an inheritance to her husband: but she that liveth dishonestly is her father's heaviness.

Ecclesiasticus 22:5 She that is bold dishonoureth both her father and her husband, but they both shall despise her.

Children's Journey and Decisions

Ecclesiasticus 22:10 But children, being haughty, through disdain and want of nurture do stain the nobility of their kindred.

Ecclesiasticus 22:9 If children live honestly, and have wherewithal, they shall cover the baseness of their parents.

Leviticus 26:39

And they that are left of you shall pine away in their iniquity in your enemies' lands; and also in the iniquities of their fathers shall they pine away with them.

Ezekiel 18:22 All his transgressions that he hath committed, they shall not be mentioned unto him: in his righteousness that he hath done he shall live.



Accountability: How to Serve the Lord in the Household

Mat 23:8

But be not ye called Rabbi: for one is your Master, even Christ; and all ye are brethren. Mat 23:10 Neither be ye called masters: for one is your Master, even Christ.

1Co 7:23

Ye are bought with a price; be not ye the servants of men

Acts of Peter Chapter 38

And when they had hanged him up after the manner he desired, he began again to say: Ye men unto whom it belongeth to hear, hearken to that which I shall declare unto you at this especial time as I hang here. Learn ye the mystery of all nature, and the beginning of all things, what it was. For the first man, whose race I bear in mine appearance (or, of the race of whom I bear the likeness), fell (was borne) head downwards, and showed forth a manner of birth such as was not heretofore: for it was dead, having no motion. He, then, being pulled down -who also cast his first state down upon the earthestablished this whole disposition of all things, being hanged up an image of the creation (Gk. vocation) wherein he made the things of the right hand into left hand and the left hand into right hand, and changed about all the marks of their nature, so that he thought those things that were not fair to be fair, and those that were in truth evil, to be good. Concerning which the Lord saith in a mystery: Unless ye make the things of the right hand as those of the left, and those of the left as those of the right, and those that are above as those below, and those that are behind as those that are before, ye shall not have knowledge of the kingdom. This thought, therefore, have I declared unto you; and the figure wherein ye now see me hanging is the representation of that man that first came unto birth. Ye therefore, my beloved, and ye that hear me and that shall hear, ought to cease from your former error and return back again. For it is right to mount upon the cross of Christ, who is the word stretched out, the one and only, of whom the spirit saith: For what else is Christ, but the word, the sound of Alahavim? So that the word is the upright beam whereon I am crucified. And the sound is that which crosseth it, the nature of man. And the nail which holdeth the cross-tree unto the upright in the midst thereof is the conversion and repentance of man.

Jhn 5:44

How can ye believe, which receive honour one of another, and seek not the honour that cometh from Alahayim only?



Jhn 8:29

And he that sent me is with me: the Father hath not left me alone; for I do always those things that please him.

A primitive root; to *rage* or *be violent*; by implication to *suppress*, to *maltreat:* - destroy, (thrust out by) oppress (-ing, -ion, -or), proud, vex, do violence.

Wherefore ye shall do my statutes, and keep my judgments, and do them; and ye shall dwell in the land in safety.

Col 4:1

Masters, give unto your servants that which is just and equal; knowing that ye also have a Master in heaven

Col 3:22 Servants, obey in all things your masters according to the flesh; not with eyeservice, as menpleasers; but in singleness of heart, fearing Alahayim:

G3787 (<u>Thayer</u>)

οφθαλμοδουλεία ophthalmodouleia

Thayer Definition:

1) service performed [only] under the master's eyes

1a) for the master's eye usually stimulates to greater diligence

1b) his absence, on the other hand, renders sluggish

Strong's Definition:

From $\underline{G_{3788}}$ and $\underline{G_{1397}}$; *sight labor*, that is, that needs watching (*remissness*): - eyeservice.

- **Remiss**: lacking care or attention to duty; negligent.

Eph 6:6

Not with eyeservice, as menpleasers; but as the servants of Christ, doing the will of Alahayim from the heart;

Eph 6:7 With good will doing service, as to the Lord, and not to men:

Eph 6:8 Knowing that whatsoever good thing any man doeth, the same shall he receive of the Lord, whether he be bond or free.

Eph 6:5 Servants, be obedient to them that are your masters according to the flesh, with fear and trembling, in singleness of your heart, as unto Christ; Eph 6:9

And, ye masters, do the same things unto them, forbearing threatening: knowing that your Master also is in heaven; neither is there respect of persons with him. 2Es 1:28

Sir 33:24

Fodder, a wand, and burdens, are for the ass; and bread, correction, and work, for a servant.

Sir 33:25

If thou set thy servant to labour, thou shalt find rest: but if thou let him go idle, he shall seek liberty.

Sir 33:26 A yoke and a collar do bow the neck: so are tortures and torments for an evil servant.

Sir 33:27 Send him to labour, that he be not idle; for idleness teacheth much evil.

Ecclesiasticus 30:8

An horse not broken becometh headstrong: and a child left to himself will be wilful.

Sir 33:28 Set him to work, as is fit for him: if he be not obedient, put on more heavy fetters.
